Sports Funding Grant Spending and Impact Information September 2021- August 2022

It is for schools to decide how the Sports Grant Funding is spent. However, they are accountable for their use of this funding. From April 2014, schools are required to publish online information about how they have used the Sports Funding. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of Physical Education and Sport, including healthy living.

As a result of restrictions during COVID19, a larger carry forward was accrued at the end of 2020 – 2021. This was also due to projects not being able to go ahead due to COVID risk assessments and safety measures that were in place.

Impact – allowed our pupils opportunities to work alongside and in competition with a wider number of peers from different local schools, thus extending the opportunity for competitive sport and team building with others.</p> <p>Professional level coaching for all EYFS, KS1 & KS2 pupils. CT and TA where appropriate, to work alongside to improve teaching skills. Impact – a higher level of skill was taught to all pupils. CT and /or TA gained continuous in-house CPD and a wealth of ideas/experience.</p> <p>Giving pupils who had attended school during Lockdown the opportunity to build and re-develop an area of the school’s as part of their project on ‘Hope and Wellbeing’. Impact –allowed pupils time to reflect on their well-being, mental health and hope during lockdown. Impacted on their positive attitude for learning and thinking of others.</p> <p>Allowed completion of whole school field shelter for use by all pupils when accessing Forest Schools, Outdoor Sports or Environmental Activities/Learning. Impact was that all pupils in school had access to various outdoor activities and learning even in inclement weather. Children were able to access new appropriate resources and work in a warm/dry environment whilst still accessing our unique rural environment. Shelter allowed for storage of new resources and comestibles and also for storage of first aid resources. Outdoor learning impact, especially during and following Covid, was essential to pupils’ well-being and mental health. Allowed children to work together in a safe environment and access specific learning to promote resilience, positive attitudes to learning. Allowed pupils to develop independent skills, to be able to challenge themselves, to be able to work as a team or a</p>

Impact – all pupils have access to adequate, appropriate equipment for on-going sport education. Outdoor areas are kept up to date and safe for all pupils.</p>
	<p>£2,732 New eco-friendly recycled 'Buddy Benches' purchased for whole school playground. To replace broken and unsafe wooden benches and redeploy areas where old planters have been removed.</p>	<p>New recycled 'Buddy Benches' allowed most pupils to be able to sit and share quiet times during playtimes. They also impacted on safety of playground area as they formed the new boundary, replacing the old, broken planters. 'Buddy Benches' allow pupils to be able to share time with their friends, share time with year 6 prefects if they need help or support and impact upon the general well-being and positivity of all pupils.</p>
	<p>£766 New storage shed for EYFS outdoor/play equipment and resources for child initiated learning.</p>	<p>New shed replace old broken unsafe shed. Houses all outdoor and much child-initiated equipment for EYFS. Impact of shed has been to allow for safe and accessible storage to enable to EYFS pupils to access a challenging, fun and creative learning environment in which to work towards their EYFS goals.</p>
	<p>£14,620 Outdoor classroom refurbishment. (Completed end of July 2022) The classroom has been completely overhauled, open sides have been closed in, new UPVC windows have been added, new storage shelving has been installed and the large area has been divided into two spaces.</p>	<p>Refurbishment of our run down original outdoor classroom will mean that pupils can once again use the area for individual, small group or whole class learning sessions in a distinct learning environment away from the usual classrooms. The area will be used for social/emotional Learning Mentor sessions, for individual or small group positive mental health and well-being sessions, for after school sport club sessions and for environmental and science learning sessions. The classroom will also be available for pupils to use at playtimes and lunch times when 'quiet/mindful activities' will be available for those pupils who need time out from the more active playground area. It provides an area of shade for outdoor learning for pupils to use safely in the summer months Pupils and staff will also be able to observe nature and wildlife in our unique rural environment in order to become more absorbed in God's world and gain a more balanced sense of well-being from the mental health benefits that it provides every day.</p>
