They thought of their own questions about The Iron Man, and the following day examined the descriptive writing about the main character with Miss Rogers, who was visiting as a supply teacher. In Maths, we have begun to consolidate and extend our understanding of fractions. The new vocabulary for this week included the words numerator and denominator.

Although the week has been a short one because of the PD Day on Monday, we continued with our art project making abstract sculptures. We also found out more about the prophet Moses as part of our Judaism study for multi-Faith Day.

Next Wednesday, Year 3 children will have an opportunity to do an extra Forest School session; we will be planting trees with Mr Kirk.
