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CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have had a great week in Class 1. The children have been working really hard and having lots of fun! In literacy, we have continued with our class book 'Simon Sock', sequencing events in the story and creating their own sock characters. In Numeracy, we have been looking at parts, wholes and number sentences as part of our work on addition. As part of our science topic on 'Weather and Seasons', the children have been investigating what happens to trees throughout the seasons. On Tuesday, we attended our school harvest service at the church. The children enjoyed listening to the story of 'Ruth', and singing harvest songs. Their behaviour, whilst walking to and from, and in the church, was excellent. Well done everyone! Have a great weekend!

Class 2

This week Class 2 have been working on multiplication and division in Maths as well as learning the 5 and 10 times tables. We have been looking at different aspects of the story, 'The tin forest', in our Literacy work. We have been making good use of our iPads for reading and recording some of our other work. We have been thinking about our families, particularly our parents and grandparents, and what school was like for them many years ago! We will be asking them lots of questions over the coming weeks, so please be prepared!

Class 3

The children have been busy developing their addition and subtraction strategies in maths. We have been looking at a range of numbers from six figure numbers to decimals, all the children have worked hard and have been working practically and in their books. We continue to find out about how the lives of children has changed down the years in history with some interesting work being produced. The children continue to develop their computer skills and are now able to access their guided reading on the I pad and answer related questions, the children are greatly enjoying this. In science we have been looking at warm blooded vertebrates and their characteristics. Have a lovely weekend everybody.

Class 4

This week in class 4, we have been busy looking at our text "The Wolves in the Walls" and have looked at the feelings of the main characters at different points in the story. In science, we have been looking at teeth and have looked at how the food animals eat impact the teeth they have. Have a lovely weekend.
