Annual Governors Statement to Parents 2023

Dear Parents and Carers

This year has seen major change at Selattyn School. In September we welcomed our new headteacher, Mr Shepherd, and we have been delighted to see how he has settled in. Alongside the governors, staff and children he has introduced our new school mission statement 'Small School, Big Heart' and updated the vision and values which embodies our school.

The children have had many opportunities to enhance their classroom learning, including a residential outdoor education visit for years 4, 5 & 6, a numeracy day at Bangor on Dee races, a trip to the zoo, and taking part in The Big Sing along with many consortium days at both The Marches School and St Martin's. Visitors to the school have given the children many valuable experiences too, including an author to celebrate World Book Day, Virgin Money, and a circus skills workshop.

It has been great to see the children taking part in many sporting activities, including swimming lessons for KS2 children at Moreton Hall School, cross country events, Queensway athletics, St Martins School Sports Festival and our own school sports day.

Parental communication has improved with the introduction of Class Dojo, a communication tool to allow parents/carers to see what children are doing in class and communicate with teachers. Termly parents' evenings have been held and annual reports sent out.

Children were able to celebrate Harvest with a special assembly in school, a coronation party for King Charles was held and our Christmas Carol concert was held at St Mary's Church.

Lots of work has been done to develop our Christian Distinctiveness working with Rev Steve Nicholson and our advisor from Lichfield Diocese, including setting up a Worship Committee. An Eco Committee and School Council have also been introduced all aiming to give the children as many opportunities as possible to take part in a range of different activities and experiences.

Staff have visited local schools, attended cluster meetings and courses with a view to developing our curriculum for the next school year.

The PTA has held several events this year including a Christmas Fayre, disco, Easter Bingo and the Summer Fayre. School is grateful as ever for their support.

Little Badgers (our parent & toddler group) has begun to meet again on a Friday morning.

In January we welcomed our new school administrator, Mrs Samson. She too has settled in very well.

Thank you to Mr Shepherd and all staff for your continued hard work and dedication this year.

Governors

3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

Targets for this year

This year our school focus has been on:

- EYFS to enhance the outdoor learning environment to help maximise the progress all children make with their learning.
- To focus on developing pupils ability to be able to recall mental maths skills rapidly and apply them across the curriculum.
- To improve inference and deduction skills through the development of guided reading throughout the school.
- To nurture and develop the Christian distinctiveness of the whole school family.
- To update the curriculum and further develop assessment tracking procedures across the school.

Finance

The governors have managed the budget this year and we are currently running without a deficit. We have committed to upgrade the IT provision for the school and await new devices ready for use in September.

Safeguarding

There have been no safeguarding incidents this year. Mr Shepherd & Mrs Hill are the designated safeguarding leads for the school.
