CLASS NEWS

Class 1

What a lovely week we've had in Class 1! We have begun our phonics programme, with 'S' and 'A' in Reception, and 'Wh' and 'Ph' in Year 1. The children have picked up the sounds quickly and had lots of opportunity to practice their skills. We have also begun our class text 'Simon Sock', ordering scenes from the text, and writing about our favourite parts of the book. In Numeracy, we have been counting and ordering numbers to 20, honing our skills with lots of practical activities. We have also begun our History topic, learning about our own timeline, ordering our daily activities. Thank you to all those parents who have sent in photos, we will be using them next Tuesday. In R.E, we have been learning about 'What makes us special?' In Science, we have begun our topic 'Sensitive Bodies', naming parts of the body. It was so lovely to see both Year groups, mixing together and working well as a team, to draw around a group member and label different parts of the body. Lastly, a reminder that the 'Bug Club Reading Meeting' will be taking place next Tuesday at 2.30p.m, in the library. It would be lovely to see all new parents there, to familiarise themselves with our phonics programme. Have a great weekend everyone!

Class 2

Friday is here again! We have continued to work on our different subjects, building up our lessons each day now to include Phonics and Spelling in the mornings. The children have brought home new spellings to learn and will be tested next Friday. On Monday we had a great afternoon doing a minibeast hunt outside. Luckily there was a break in the rain! Fun was had by all as the children read clues and searched various microhabitats to find the minibeasts living there. We are hoping to go up to the top field next week. (Please remember Outdoor Learning is every Monday this term and kit will need to be brought in). We are loving our Art sessions, exploring using different materials; this week we made rubbings with wax crayon to create different textures. In Geography we used Google Earth to locate wonderful landmarks in the U.K., including the Tower of London, Edinburgh Castle, Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon) and the Giant's Causeway. The children are going to write about these landmarks next week. We capped off the week today by making some lovely story cubes, telling the Parable of The Prodigal Son and discussing what it tells us about God. These are now on display in the classroom. Well done everyone. See you next week!

Class 3

We have had another productive week in class. All the children completed their homework brilliantly which was very pleasing to see, well done everyone! English homework plus reading, spellings and times tables will go out today. We have been continuing to develop our understanding of grammar in English lessons and have carried out numerous activities on tenses and speech amongst other things. In maths we have completed our unit of work on place value and all the children have developed their understanding of rounding, sequencing and partioning numbers. Swimming was again much fun with all the children making great progress. Have a fantastic weekend everybody!

Class 4

Another busy week and I can't believe it's Friday again already! We have moved on to addition in maths and have been adding whole numbers and decimals. All the children are grasping the concepts well and we are speeding through our work. In literacy we are now on Chapter 11 of our book Skellig and the characters are really coming to life. We have written some amazing monologues writing as different characters from the text. We have also been practising the spelling of there, their and they're and there is some homework on this to ensure understanding. Thank you to everyone for completing the homework. It will always link directly to something we are doing in class and is an excellent opportunity for the children to gain extra practice in areas of learning requiring that extra bit of consolidation. If you haven't already signed up to Seesaw, please do, as we are regularly posting photos of activities in class so you can see how hard all the children are working. 
