

CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have had a very busy week in Class 1! We began by learning all about Shrove Tuesday and Lent. Then, the children read, wrote and followed instructions how to make pancakes. Reception children weighed out and made the pancakes, choosing their topping, and cutting them into halves. Year 1 children chose a topping, then cut their pancake into quarters. We then used this information to make a graph of the most popular topping... Chocolate sauce won! In Science, we learned all about the senses, and which part of the body is used for each sense. On Wednesday afternoon, we had a field trip around the village. The children took photos of both 'Physical' and 'Human' features, using a cuddly toy for scale. They were all able to distinguish between the two , and as usual, behaved wonderfully. It was lovely to see all the children dressed up in their pyjamas for World Book Day, ready to be cosy and read. We have started our new Geography topic, 'What is it like to live on the Coast?', our D.T. topic, 'Constructing a Castle' and our Science topic, 'Light and Shadows'. The children loved being in their pyjamas and were very enthusiastic about their reading too.
