CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have had another productive week in Class 1. This week we continued learning our phonics, with Year 1 learning all the ways that 'oo' can be written, and Reception learning the 'e, u and r' phonemes. We also began our class text 'The Night Box' by Louise Greig. In Numeracy, we have been learning how to count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10, using a hundred square. In Science, we have begun our topic of 'Materials'. We sorted everyday objects into items made from wood, plastic, glass, metal and other, and investigated their properties. In Geography, we continued learning about 'Where we are in the U.K?', by investigating different types of maps and aerial photographs. The children then used their knowledge, working in pairs, to create their own 'Messy Maps' of the classroom. In D.T, the children created templates to make their hand puppets. In R.E, we began learning about 'The Nativity' and started to learn carols for the Christmas Concert. Have a great weekend everyone!

Class 2

Friday again! This week seems to have flown by! The children have been busy starting their new topics. In Science, they were sorting different objects according to their materials and discussing why particular materials are chosen. Yesterday, we looked at how schools have changed over time and created a timeline showing some differences. We are excited to investigate the history of our school and gather memories from those who can remember being here. Thank you to those parents who have already responded. We are hoping to gather some photos and information to construct a class timeline for the school. In Literacy we have been empathising with the main character, Wilf, and remembering times when we have been lost. In maths, we are beginning to get our learning of times tables underway. Next week we will be starting some work on fractions. It was great to end the week in colourful clothing and give to such a worthwhile charity. Have a great weekend!

Class 3

We have had another busy week in Class Three. As we head towards Christmas the parts to the Carol Concert have been shared with the children. Everyone in class has been given a short piece to practise and learn as part of their homework. We will continue to rehearse next week. In maths we have moved on with our work and are now focusing on measurement and how to convert various units. This has included some measuring and estimating. For our English sessions we have been revising different tenses and learning which tense to use in different contexts. In Design Technology we have been looking at adapting a recipe and had fun making biscuits this week! Have a great weekend everyone!

Class 4

Well what an end to the week! We have been indoors all day due to the constant rain! However, we had some great outfits for Children in Need. Thank you for your donations. The cake sale also did well at the end of the day (despite the rain) thanks to our One Voice Team. Today for our Design & Technology, we have been working on our embroidery skills for our stuffed toys. Lots of children surprised themselves in their own abilities and I'm sure if you have any socks that require darning, the children are ready to help now!! In Literacy we have started our new book; Tom's Midnight Garden and we have looked at the language used within the text. This led to some amazing descriptive writing today.
