CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have had a lovely week in Class 1. We have continued with our class book 'Simon Sock', writing letters and ordering sentences. In Maths, we have been investigating 2D and 3D shapes, using our class iPads to photograph shapes in our environment. In History, we have been comparing our lives to those of children in the past, and noticing the changes. In Art, we have worked collaboratively, to draw lines, inspired by water and art by Zaria Forman..... Pretty apt for today's weather!!

Class 2

Class 2 have worked hard this week on using correct punctuation in sentences. In Maths we have completed our work on measuring, this week focussing on measuring capacity in litres and millilitres. We have continued our work on schools in the past, looking at what classrooms were like one hundred years ago. We have been writing about ourselves in French, describing ourselves using the words we have been learning over the past few weeks. We are also continuing to practice our spellings and times tables, ready for our tests every Friday.

Class 3

Another busy week in Class Three has passed us by! We have been looking at strategies for multiplying and dividing focusing on how to transfer our skills to other areas of the curriculum and problem solving in maths. In English we have been writing for an audience developing our creative writing and editing our work. We are enjoying our guided reading texts and responding well to the different texts using key strategies. In French we have been rehearsing key vocabulary and in computing we have been learning how IT is used in different ways to communicate key information. Have a good weekend everybody.

Class 4

We have been looking at multiplication this week in maths. We have looked at multiples, factors and prime numbers. Next week, we will be looking at written methods. In English, we have been busy planning our stories based on 'The Wolves in The Walls'. We have also been looking at what makes us happy and the different types of emotions in PSHE.
