CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have had another busy week in Class 1! In Maths, we have been learning the names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes. This culminated in working in pairs, to take photos of shapes in our school environment, which they really enjoyed. In Phonics, Reception children have continued Phase 2 sounds, learning the 'g', 'o', 'c' and 'k' phonemes. Their recognition of sounds and blending is really coming along, which is wonderful to see! Year 1 children have been learning all the ways to read and write the 'oa' phoneme. I was really pleased that they were all able to recall them by the end of the week. In History, we continued with our theme 'Learning about our own history', finding out about how our grandparents used to live, sorting artefacts from the past and the present. We had our last singing practice this week, ready for our Harvest Festival in the church, on Thursday. The children did a great job, and their behaviour, both to and from the church, and during the service, was excellent. Well done children! Thank you to everyone who sent in their harvest donations, they were very gratefully received. Have a wonderful weekend everyone!

Class 2

Week 7!! It seems to have flown by as we have been very busy, of course. We have been continuing our work on The Tin Forest, as we approach our final piece which is to plan and write our own story. In Maths, we have been looking at adding over a tens or hundreds boundary. Next week we will be concentrating on subtraction. In Geography on Monday, we were working outside, using an aerial map to navigate compass points and find certain locations withing the school grounds. The children were very excited on Tuesday to be drawing their own soft toy. They used pencil chalk and charcoal to add tone and texture and the results were quite impressive. Well done! We have also set up a wormery to observe earthworms in our Science lessons next week. Today the children rounded off their week by welcoming Reverand Steve to our R.E. Lesson. He came to discuss The Parable of The Prodigal Son and the children impressed him with their thoughts and comments. Well done Class 2. Also, this afternoon in Music they wrote some lyrics to a short film (called 'Soar' and available on you tube) and they chose the backing track to 'Wind of Change', by the Scorpians. Again, this, and the karaoke version are available on you tube, if the children want to show you. Have a great weekend!

Class 3

We have had a lovely week in Class Three. The children have now completed their swimming sessions. The instructors were extremely impressed with the groups swimming and said they were a delight to teach. In class we completed our unit of work on developing addition and subtraction strategies and have now started to look at the other two rules of number, multiplication and division. The children are really enjoying our class story 'The Wolves in the Walls' and have produced some great creative writing, it's been super to read everyone's work! In I.T. The children have been developing skills to use the internet safely and preparing some French conversations to share with each other in their language lesson. Thank you to everyone who brought in donations for the food bank for harvest, greatly appreciated. Remember we hold our Parent's Evenings next Monday and Tuesday, look forward to seeing you! 
Class 4
