CLASS NEWS

Class 1

We have been very busy again this week in Class 1. In Numeracy, we have been counting in 2's, 10's and 5's, and finding patterns within the multiples. In Literacy, we have been creating and describing our own 'Wild Things', using time connectives and joining sentences with the word 'and'. In Science, we have updated our seasonal records, by recording facts about Spring. These included temperature, daylight hours and changes in deciduous trees. In Art, we have been using our knowledge of colour-mixing, to paint our own 'Wild things' in watercolours, as part of a class display. Have a wonderful week everyone!

Class 2

It has been a very busy week in Class 2. Year 2 have been doing their SATS tests. It has gone really well, with everyone trying really hard and completing their tests carefully and within the time allowed. Well done Year 2! Year 3 have been working with Class 4 during these sessions, with the challenge of doing their Maths work alongside the Year 4 and 5 children. They have really enjoyed the change of scene and have tried their best with all of the tasks set by Mr. Smaje. We have been looking at how mankind developed between the Neolithic Stone Age and the Iron Age in our History work. We really enjoyed our P.E. session on Thursday afternoon with Mr. Graham, spending half of the afternoon doing Athletics and the other half doing Dance. Both of the activities were really fun!

Class 3

Well done to all the children this week! We have now completed our Statutory Assessment Tests. The whole class tried immensely hard and did their best over the week which was a credit to themselves, we were proud of them all. We can now once again continue to focus on our writing work through our class novel 'Wonder' and all the other subjects across the curriculum which we have missed doing this week. One week to half term when the children can have a well deserved rest from all their hard work. Have a great weekend everyone!

Class 4

Another very busy week in Class 4. It was lovely to have Year 3 join us for our maths lessons this week, where we have been looking at perimeter and area. Year 5's have also been looking at what volume is. In English, we have worked hard writing monologues from a character's perspective. We have also looked at haiku poems and wrote examples linking to 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.' In PSHE, we have looked at 'privacy' and had an in-depth conversation regarding various situations which the children may encounter and support which is available. We have also looked at natural disasters in science and have looked at mummification in our history lesson this week. Have a lovely weekend everybody.
