CLASS NEWS

Class 1

Well, we made it to half-term! I am so pleased with the way everyone has gelled together, settling into new routines and making new friends. This week, we have been finishing off our topic 'All About Me' and completing our half-termly reading tests for Year 1. In Literacy, we had a lot of fun, as Year 1 children wrote clues for Reception children to find missing socks, and then wrote letters to Ted to explain where we found them all. In Maths, we investigated prepositions and direction, so that we could describe, as best we could, where the socks were located. In Science, we finished off learning about senses by investigating touch and smell, guessing items in a 'feely box' and guessing household ingredients using smell alone! As Divali was celebrated this week by many in the country, we read the book 'The Best Divali Ever', learning about Hindu customs at this special time of year. In Computing, the children have been making 3D rockets to use in coding, and in Art, the children have completed their 'Line-Drawing' topic. Finally, thank you to all of you who came to Parent's Evening. It was so lovely to catch up and discuss your wonderful children. Have a great Half-Term break everyone!

Class 2

We finally made it to the end of the Half term! The children have all worked so hard over the past eight weeks and are now in the swing of things in the classroom. Well done everyone! We have all enjoyed all the topics we have been learning about and the different activities, particularly those more active ones! We will be continuing with our Outdoor Learning next half term (on Monday afternoons), but instead of Art, we will be doing Design Technology (Textiles) and instead of Geography, it will be History (How was school different in the past?). Our book focus in Literacy will also change and we will have a new focus in Maths after the holiday. Have a lovely break everyone and come back refreshed and ready for more hard work!

Class 3

What a great first half term we have all had in Class Three! We have achieved lots since the start of term. In maths we have been developing our understanding with number by focusing on the four rules investigating, addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. In English we have concluded our work on the 'Wolves in the Walls' and have produced some thoughtful creative writing which we have enjoyed sharing with each other. All children are coming home with their 'Spelling Frame' log in. This will provide everyone with challenges and activities to carry out based on our new spelling patterns. Children have also been encouraged to log into Times Table Rockstars and practise their fluency at recalling their tables. In Geography we have completed our topic with a debate on importing or buying local. See seesaw for our debate. We've enjoyed our computing topic all about the Internet. I hope you all have a great half term break and I will see you back in class on Tuesday 4th November.

Class 4

Well, we have made it to half term! Eight weeks gone already! This week we have finished our book Skellig and will be creating a sequel to the story when we return after half term. We have been working on angles in maths and have all worked well. We finished our Art Unit with children arriving in school at 8.30am and using their pre-prepared tile, for block printing. The work looks great and was all done by 9.15am! The disco last night was lots of fun, although it was hard to recognise some of the children! I must say, both myself and Miss McAvoy have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know all the children and teaching them for this first half term. They really are a great bunch. - Video feedback will be sent to you (upon consent from the school and parents) to keep you updated on your child's progress.
- A school concert will be held once a year where you can come and watch your child play live in a school performance.


