In D.T, this week, Year 1 children have been designing moving books, to read to Reception, containing 'Pop-Ups' and 'Sliders'. We also were very grateful to receive some new equipment for our outdoor area, including a reading teepee, some odd and even number logs, a blackboard alphabet to attach to the fence, and some new planters. Aren't we lucky!

Class 2

This week the Year 3 children have been doing their end of term tests. The Year 2 children don't have any because they recently did their SATS tests. The tests are in Maths, Grammar & Punctuation, Reading Comprehension and Spelling. They have concentrated hard and done very well. All of the children now have a writing journal book, which they have been using to write about things which are important to them, or they are interested in, or excited about. They have free choice and have enjoyed writing in them so far. In our Geography work we have been learning more about comparisons between urban and rural areas, comparing rural England to the city of New Delhi in India. It has been really interesting work. We have been learning the names of vegetables in French. We particularly like the French word for mushroom - champignon, which is a lovely word to say!
