### **CLASS NEWS**

#### Class 1

It was wonderful to welcome back everyone on Tuesday and hear all their wonderful holiday news! We have now begun our new theme of 'Light and Dark' and started our new class text 'The Night Box'. In Literacy, the children have continued on their phonics journey, by recapping sounds and tricky words and learning the 'ck' and 'ew' phonemes this week. We have also learned about 'The Gunpowder Plot' and created sound words that we may hear on Bonfire Night. In Maths, we have been concentrating on place value, number formation and using 2D shapes for bonfire art. In Science, we investigated 'Seasonal Change', concentrating on the signs of Autumn. In Geography, this week, we have been researching our locality, finding and labelling features on an aerial photograph. In D.T, we have begun our topic of 'Textiles', aiming to make a hand puppet ready for Christmas. Have a wonderful weekend everyone!

## Class 2

We're back! The children have settled in quite well to the beginning of the second half term. With Autumn well under way, darker days, poppies on sale and Christmas on the horizon(!), it feels like Winter is approaching fast. In class we have started new topics including our new text 'Way Home for Wolf', by Rachel Bright and Jim Field. The setting for this is the Arctic, so it's very seasonal! In maths we have been working on multiplication and looking at how this can be represented in arrays. We will continue with this next week, relating it to division. In Science we checked in on the worms in the wormery before releasing them back to their microhabitat. We were amazed to see that at least one has burrowed down to the base layers. Next week we will begin our new topic 'Uses of Everyday Materials'. Our History topic this term is 'How Schools have Changed', so if anyone has memories of their school days (maybe attending this school?!) that would interest the children, please let us know! Have a great weekend!

# Class 3

We have all enjoyed our first week back in class since the half term break. We are looking at the properties of shape in maths and have revised some key terms linked to describing different 2D shapes. Everyone is having the opportunity to draw and investigate a range of shapes and become more confident in describing them. Our new English unit of work is poetry based on the seasons, our work on this will lead to analysing a range of poetic forms and creating our own versions throughout the term. We are all becoming more confident in recalling our tables and becoming faster at this, keep up the good work! We have started some of our new topics. In history we have been looking at Roman buildings and what they were used for. We had a lovely afternoon for D & T taste testing biscuits for taste, appearance and texture. We also looked at the packaging and which people the packaging was aimed at. In French, we are looking at food and drink. Have a lovely weekend everyone!

# Class 4

First week back with only four days but we haven't stopped! Our Guided Reading sessions focussed on the history of Bonfire Night and in our daily worship we linked this to argument of whether fireworks should be made quieter. In maths we have looked at shapes and matching the correct NET to the 3D shape. There is some homework on this just to ensure children can name a good range of 3D shapes. Several of our children have been selling poppies and other items to raise money for the Royal British Legion. The children have enjoyed this and our collection tin is becoming quite heavy. In Literacy we have now finished writing our sequels to the Skellig story and will start our new book next week. Have a lovely weekend everyone.


